Science

Year 5: Matter Matters In this unit students will:

- broaden their classification of matter to include gases and begin to see how matter structures the world around them.
- They will understand that solids, liquids and gases have some shared and some distinct observable properties and can behave in different ways.

Year 6: Making Changes

In this unit, students will:

- investigate changes that can be made to materials and how these changes are classified as reversible or irreversible.
- plan investigation methods using fair testing to answer questions.

English

Year 5: Appreciating and responding to literary texts

In this unit, students share, develop and expand on ideas and opinions, using supporting details from topics or texts. They will use different text structures to organise, develop and link ideas. Students will use language features including topicspecific vocabulary and literary devices, and multimodal features and features of voice.

Year 6: Exploring Literary Texts by the Same Author

In this unit, students will engage with a variety of literary texts that support and extend them as independent readers. Students will read, view and comprehend past and contemporary literary texts, exploring how literary devices, are used to enhance meaning and for effect. Through texts, students will explore contexts in which texts were created and how characters, setting, events or ideas are represented by authors. They will discuss how the author uses unique structures and language features to show context and themes in texts.
